- According to the United Nations MDG dashboard South Africa is ranked 147 out of 189 UN countries

Swaziland 177	Leshotho 162
Namibia 156	Zimbabwe 165

- We have made great strides but we have far to go in reaching 2015 indicators.

- NPO alliances and coalitions with corporates and government are uniting in the common mission of achieving the Millennium Development Goals

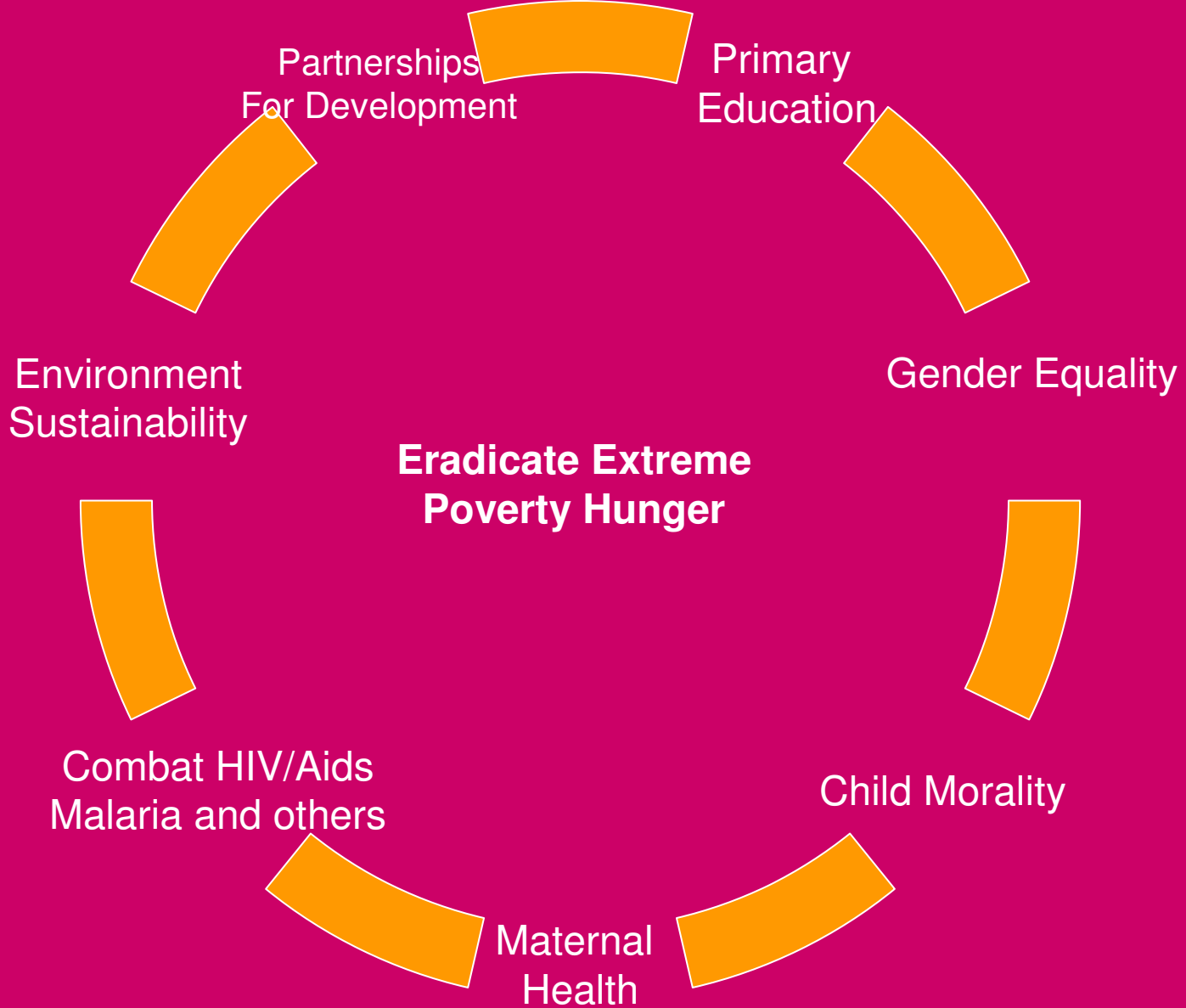

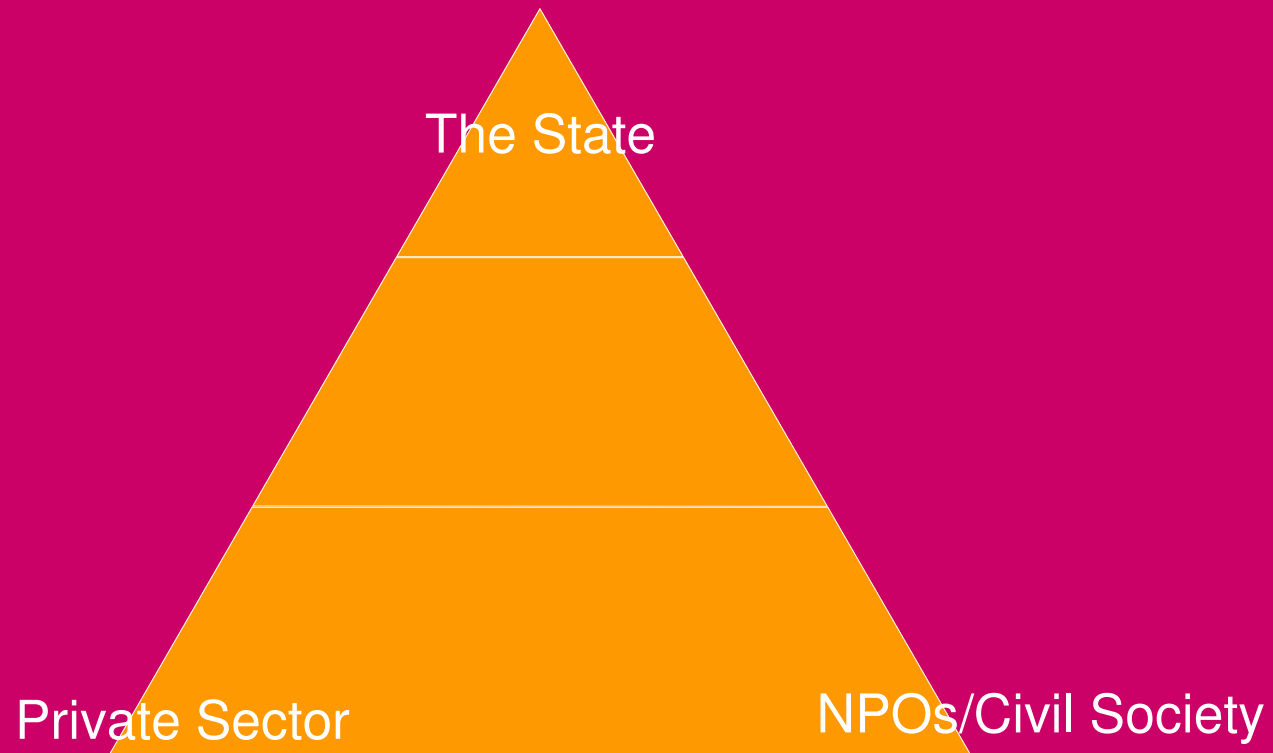


# NPO Scan in South Africa

- 110 000-160 000 non-profit organisations (CBO's mostly)
- 80 000 are registered with the NPO Secretariat (Department of Social Development)
- Value of over R5 billion in voluntary service
- Employing over 1,5 million people

# 10 Reasons

Why NPOs are a wise choice as implementers?

1. They are community based and operate where poverty lives.
2. They have programmes in place that are already *attacking* poverty.
3. They have local knowledge and are culturally sensitive and speak indigenous languages.
4. They understand poverty and have success in a quick turnaround (Impact).
5. They are lean and more cost effective.

6. They are able to work with other groups and form clusters for more effective delivery.
7. They can assist business with meeting SED and BBBEE score cards
8. They are flexible and can adapt to change and new trends.
9. They make use of ICT for development work and report back in realtime
10. They can align their existing successes and future programmes with MDGs.
